

Why and how do cities change? What effect do these changes have on our lives?

Contrary to popular belief, cities are not static by nature. Every brick, every building, every street represents innumerable decisions.

Developed in partnership with Universcience, **Urban Mutations: The changing Face of Cities** is a permanent exhibition at the Science Centre Singapore that focuses on the transformation of cities in our world today and reassess the role we, as city residents, have to play.

Today, about 55% of the world's population is living in cities and likely to rise to around 70% by 2050. Understanding what this means for urbanisation in the coming years is critical to plan and build cities that are smart enough to survive the challenges of the 21st century.

The Urban Mutations exhibition aims to address these questions and explore the stories of a few select cities modelled around sustainability, greening, diversity and smart technologies.

Structured around three themes – Cities Under Pressure, Urban Earth and Urban Futures – this latest exhibition showcases the current state of cities and urges visitors to start questioning their urban practices and reflect how their everyday choices contribute to building a city of the future.

Guests stroll through the exhibition area as they would through the streets of a city. In the first zone, they will gain an understanding of different components that make up the city, the tensions that might arise, and an opportunity to deliberate on being an urbanite today. The journey then continues to a greater global appreciation of cities from far, before entering the third and final space that showcases urban innovations and imagination selected for their originality, specificity, or exemplary character.





Through this exhibition, guests are encouraged to reflect on the active and informed role they need to play in building the cities of tomorrow.
