At the Science Centre's DNA Lab, guests can participate in **Discovering DNA**—a unique opportunity to delve into the world of genetics through interactive experiments like DNA extraction and microscopy.

Sneak Peek at a Roaring New Exhibition

Attendees will get to catch a sneak peek into Science Centre's upcoming year-end exhibition, developed in collaboration with the Lee Kong Chian Natural History Museum (LKCNHM). The experience, themed around extinctions and dinosaurs, will feature an extraordinary journey spanning 400 million years of Earth's history. 




3. Kitz the Cat's - Secret of The Space Station

4. Star Dreaming

In the arid heartland of Western Australia, Lucia and Max visit the remote site of the largest science facility ever built by mankind: the SKA (Square Kilometre Array) radio telescope. There, they learn about the global effort behind the SKA and the fundamental scientific questions it hopes to answer, including: Is there life somewhere else in the universe? Next, Max and Lucia enter the ancient land of the Yamaji people, Aboriginal Australians who have shared star stories for more than 60,000 years. Artist Charmaine Green guides Max and Lucia through the land of her ancestors and introduces them to other artists, their paintings, and their tales.

Through their journey, Lucia and Max discover how much the scientific world and the ancient world have in common, for we all live under one sky—a shared sky.
