

About International Science Drama Competition 2021

The International Science Drama Competition is a yearly event that encourages participants to marry their passion for science with acting. This competition is open to teams from Singapore schools, the public as well as teams from overseas. It is an excellent platform for participants to display their talents and compete on an international stage, and is surely an opportunity that is not to be missed.

This year, we are pleased to introduce a brand new "Short Films Category" on top of the existing Junior and Open Categories. This new category will be open to everyone where participants can portray their flair in filming and video editing in line with the theme.

In addition, with the recent Safe Management Measures for COVID-19, there are some changes to the existing submission process and performance delivery for this competition. The competition will be held online through video submissions. There will not be a physical competition in Science Centre.

Performance/Short Film Guidelines

- All performances and short films should be in the form of a short skit not exceeding 7 minutes.
- All performances and short films should be based on the theme of "Sustainable Agriculture for a
 Better Future" commemorating 2021 as the International Year of Creative Economy for
 Sustainable Development and the International Year of Fruits and Vegetables.
- The performance should combine scientific content and drama.
- Examples of some possible topics include but are not limited to the following:
 - a. Farming using renewable energy sources
 - b. Hydroponics and Aquaponics
 - c. Food security
 - d. Protecting the environment as we meet society's food and textile needs

Competition Rules

- Each school or organisation can register as many teams as they want.
- Each team must comprise of a maximum of 15 participants, including backstage crew for Junior and Open Categories and video editors for Short Film Category.

Note: Backstage crew can only assist to place props, control AV and help cast members backstage and should not be involved in the skit as cast members; teachers or adults can assist as backstage crew.

- All performances and short films should be in English and should not exceed 7 minutes. A penalty will be imposed for performances exceeding 7 minutes.
- All entries for all categories will be submitted via video submission. Teams will be judged based
 on their video entries for this year's competition; there will be no live rehearsals or live
 performance for the Singapore Finals.
- All sources for storyline, music and other media must be properly credited and acknowledged.
- If participants are representing a school or organisation, all participants in the team must be current students or members of the school or organisation.
- Should a school or organisation decide to register more than 1 team in the same category, there
 should be no repetition of team members across teams; the same team members can, however,
 participate across categories, e.g. Member A can take part in Junior Category and Short Films
 Category
- Should a team participate in more than one category, the same storyline cannot be repeated.















Junior Category:

 All participants must be age 12 or below, excluding teachers or adults who can assist as backstage crew.

Open Category:

• There is no age limit for participants; teams will compete in this category when at least one member is above age 12.

Short Films Category:

• There is no age limit for participants.

Video Submission Rules and Regulations

- Each team is to upload the video onto YouTube. Please set the Privacy Settings of your video to Unlisted.
- Please submit the link to the YouTube video and softcopy of the performance scripts (including a short synopsis) to Mr See Eng Sheng at see eng sheng@science.edu.sg or Ms Lim Huan at lim huan@science.edu.sg by 5 May 2021. Please ensure that the team name and organisation/school (if applicable) are clearly stated in all submissions, as well as the category.
- Teams must ensure that the recording is clear, and the sound is clearly audible.
- Late submissions will not be accepted in the competition.

Junior and Open Categories:

- Teams are encouraged to add English subtitles to the performance
- Videos should have NO cuts/editing in between (other than the addition of English subtitles);
 whole video must be in one take

Short Films Category:

- English subtitles must be included in the film
- Videos can have cuts/editing in between; part of the grading criteria will be on cinematography and video editing













Checklist for Video Submission

- YouTube video link
- Softcopy of script (including a short synopsis)
- Names of participants in block letters (Please ensure that the names are correct as this will be used for certificate purposes)

Finalists Notification

- The top five videos from each category will be shortlisted for the Singapore Finals.
- Shortlisted Singapore finalists will be informed by **19 May 2021**. Shortlisted teams may choose to submit a new video (no change in storyline) or use the existing video submitted during the preliminary round for the Singapore Finals. Videos for the Singapore Finals should be submitted by **7 June 2021**.
- Judging for the Singapore Finals will consist of 2 components judges score and online poll.
- The shortlisted videos will also be posted on an online polling system from **14 23 June 2021 2359hrs**.
- The Final Results for this competition will be announced on 28 June 2021.

Grand Finals

- The winning Singapore teams for each category will be representing Singapore to compete against the overseas winners in the Grand Finals.
- Grand Finals will be held online between July September 2021.
- More details will be shared with the winning teams after the Singapore Finals.
