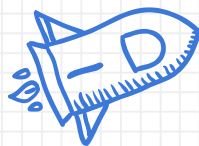

Important Safety Guidelines

Liquid Nitrogen is NOT allowed



Gloves are a MUST

Please put on gloves when handling dry ice and chemicals.



Max 3% Hydrogen Peroxide allowed

A maximum concentration of 3% for Hydrogen Peroxide is allowed. It is dangerous for students to handle more than that.



NO open flame or flammable gases

Fire is a potential danger for everyone

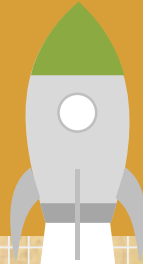


ONLY over-the-counter chemicals/materials are allowed

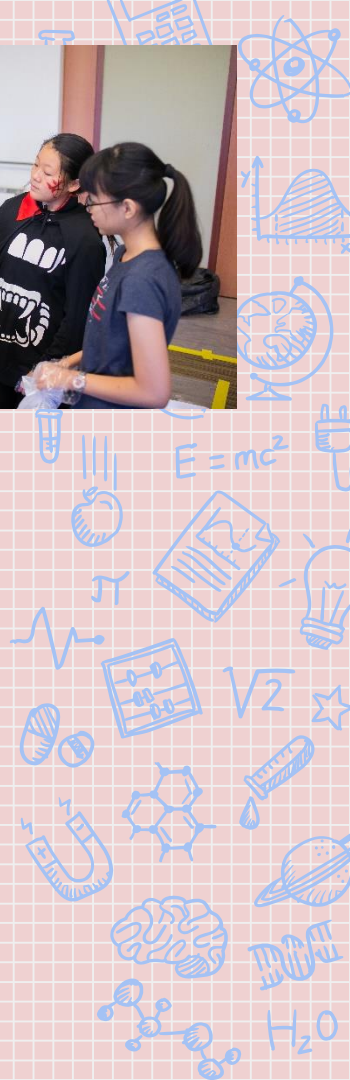
Video Submission Guidelines



Rules

What to Submit?

- Each individual / team project can only submit one short video that is no longer than **4 minutes**.
- Busking on any STEM topics
- Challenge is to explain STEM concepts in **everyday language making it fun** without compromising on the science accuracy
- *It will be like your physical/normal science busking demonstration in front of judges just putting it on video*

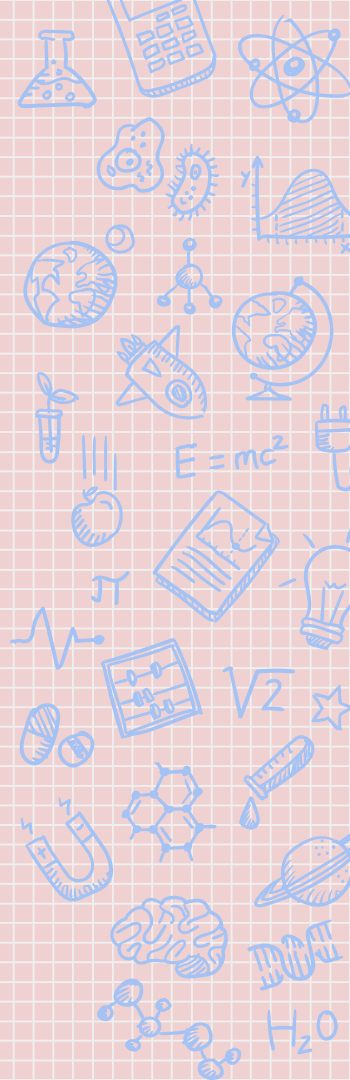


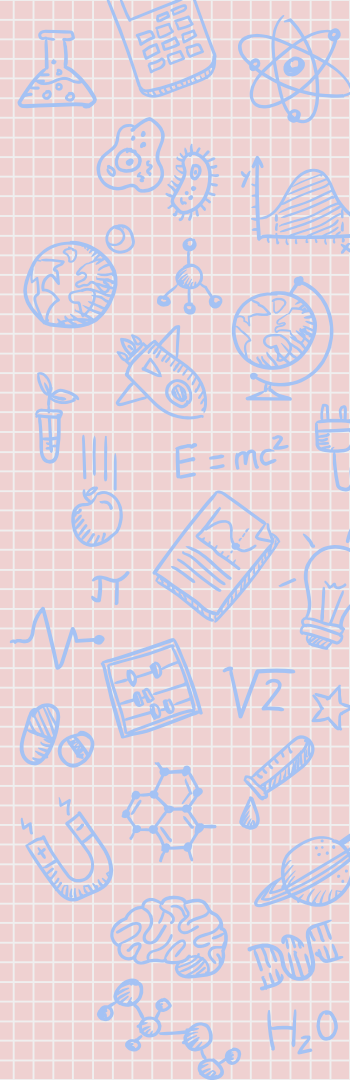


Video Submission Guidelines

Rules

- Background music or sounds effects are allowed (it must not be part of the demo if your topic is or involves 'Sound')
- All videos that contain obscene, provocative, objectionable or otherwise inappropriate content will be disqualified.





Video Submission Guidelines

Rules

What is NOT permitted?

- Animation is **NOT** allowed.
- Voice over is **NOT** allowed (showing just slides/diagrams etc with voices)
- All videos must **NOT** be created with professional assistance.
- Adults/Non-participants are allowed to be fringe actors/'kalafare'/'extras' or cameraman but **NOT** content contributors.



Video Submission Guidelines

IP Rights

- All videos must be original work conceived and created by the students. No copyrighted materials (e.g. images, music, etc.) may be used in the video unless the students own the copyright or have a license to use the material for the video contest.
- If the students have gained formal permission to use any copyrighted materials (e.g. images, music, etc.) under terms and conditions stipulated by the copyright owners, the students need to include an acknowledgment / credit at the end of the video.
- The use of logos including known commercial brands, institutional crests or trademarks, unless integral to the project, is not allowed in the video.
- Ownership of the underlying intellectual property of the video remains with the student(s) of the individual/team project, with the following exception:
- Students grant the organiser the right to use, distribute and display their videos without further compensation or notification to the student(s).
- Students grant the organiser the right to use their images and videos for publicity and advertising without further compensation or notification to the student(s).

Video Submission Guidelines

Rules

How to submit?

- Students are required to upload their videos on YouTube (set as 'unlisted') and submit the video links to their school coordinator(s).
- On YouTube, the format of the title of the video should be '[School] - [Team Name]' E.g. 'Science Centre Pri - Sounders' or 'Science Centre Sec - Senses'
- **Submission by schools** - All school coordinators are required to collate the video links in the **excel sheet (to be provided by organiser)** and submit to the following email address: upstream@science.edu.sg and marcus_fa@science.edu.sg
- The excel filename should be 'SBF2020 Video Link [Name of school]' E.g. **SBF2020 Video Link XYZ Sec.**

FAQs



1. I've a song that I would like to use as background music. Can I use it in my video?

- For all materials (e.g. images, music, etc.) that do not belong to you and you are using them in your video, please find out if they are copyrighted. If you have gained formal permission to use the material (in this case a song) under terms and conditions stipulated by the copyright owner, you need to include an acknowledgment/credit at the end of your video.

2. I've an acknowledgment/credit at the end of my video. Is this frame counted within the 2 minutes of the video?

- No.

3. I have logos (e.g. research institute's crest, school crest, brands on food packages/equipment/props, etc.) in my video. Is that alright?

- No logo should be present in the video, including the end credits. Please either remove the logos or tape over to hide the logos.

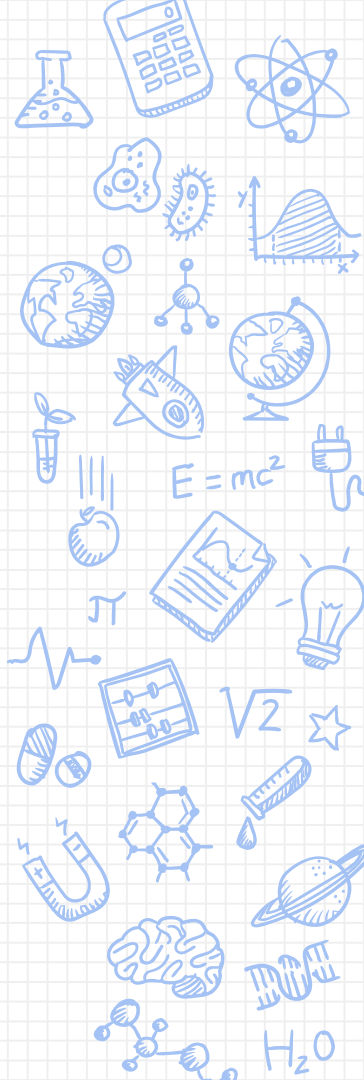
4. Do I need sophisticated equipment and software to produce my video?

- You don't need fancy equipment nor software. You can produce a with just a camera phone!



Judging Criteria *(for both scenarios)*

Score	Judging Criteria
35%	Science Communication <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Explanations of demonstrations shown must be scientifically accurate, and use scientifically precise and correct language without overwhelming the audience with jargon.• Ability to explain science concepts in everyday language without compromising on the science accuracy
35%	Showmanship <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ability to engage, interest and excite the audience• How much 'wow' factor in the busking• Ability to make the audience feel inspired and walk away with the feeling that they have learnt something
30%	Setup, Costume, Overall look and feel <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Creative and innovative ways of showcasing demonstrations• Blending of the look & feel with the science concepts presented• Creative booth design concepts

- ***The organiser decision on all matters relating to this competition shall be final, conclusive and binding. The organiser is not obligated to give any reasons on any matter in the competition.***



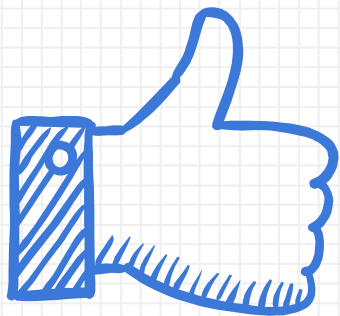
