



## Terms & Conditions

*Last updated: 24 Jan 2024*

The Programme that the following Terms and Conditions refer to is Horizon Hydrogen Grand Prix Singapore, energised by Chevron (H2GPSg). The Organisers of the programme are Science Centre Singapore, Chevron and Horizon Educational. The representatives that organise, manage and execute the Programme form the Organising Committee.

### 1. Commitment to the Programme

- a. Horizon Hydrogen Grand Prix Singapore, energised by Chevron (H2GPSg) takes place from March to September 2024.
- b. Participation in the Programme consists of the following compulsory components:
  - i. Teacher-in-charge's attendance at a full-day training workshop, held on 8 March 2024 at Science Centre Singapore.
  - ii. Student team's completion of H2GP educational syllabus, to be conducted by teacher-in-charge at a recommended pace of 3 hours per week for 16 weeks from March to June 2024 (at the latest before the national competition on 3 and 4 August 2024). The syllabus includes submission of the technical report and oral presentation at the national competition.
  - iii. Team's participation at the H2GP Singapore 2024 national competition, held on 3 and 4 August 2024 at Science Centre Singapore.
- c. Non-compulsory, but recommended components are:
  - i. Team's participation in tech chat sessions.
  - ii. Mid-season monitoring visits by Organising Committee.
- d. By registering for the programme, teams acknowledge the commitment level and duration required and are expected to adhere to all the compulsory sessions and follow through the course of the programme. In the event that the team or its student(s) are unable to do so, the following will apply:
  - i. Teams are allowed to swap up to two students no more than one month from the commencement of the Curriculum at the discretion of the teacher-in-charge. Further than this, a request has to be made to the Organising Committee supported by a valid reason. The Organising Committee will review the request on a case-by-case basis and reserves the right to accept or reject the request (i.e. impose a penalty). The Organising Committee must be notified of any swap in team members as soon as possible.
  - ii. If the entire team pulls out within the first month from commencement of the Curriculum, they will be required to return the kit immediately.
  - iii. If the entire team pulls out after the first month from commencement of the Curriculum, they will be required to return the kit immediately and the school will not be allowed to take part in the Programme in the following year.
- e. For polytechnics and ITE only: Due to the difference in enrollment schedule, teacher-in-charge may register your team in advance by 29 Feb 2024 and list the students as 'Student 1/2/3/4/5'. The participating students' details must be submitted by end June 2024.

### 2. Selection of Teams

- a. The Organising Committee will select 20 teams to participate in the Programme.
- b. The following factors may be taken into consideration in the selection process, in no particular order:
  - i. Emphasis will be placed on upper secondary to tertiary year one students.
  - ii. Equal opportunities for underprivileged schools or students.
  - iii. Diversity of schools (unique number of schools represented).

- iv. Equal opportunities for girls in STEM (number of female team members).
- v. Teams' opened-ended response to why they deserve a spot in the programme.
- c. The Organising Committee reserves the right to select the teams at its sole discretion and its decision is final.

### 3. Fair Competition and Adherence to Rules

- a. The H2GP Singapore Nationals and World Final competition follow a set of rules detailed in the official rulebooks. Teams are expected to read and comply with the requirements laid out in the rulebooks prior to and during the competitions.
- b. Cheating is strictly not tolerated. Any teams or team members that fail to abide by the rules will have their team penalised or disqualified. In cases of alleged rule-breaking, the judges' decision is final in accordance with the authority conferred by the Organising Committee.
- c. If any clarification on the rules is required, teams may write in to the Organising Committee before the competition. Claims of ignorance will not be accepted as a valid excuse for rule-breaking.
- d. Teams are expected to compete with a spirit of mutual learning and fair play within the team and amongst other teams. Team members shall not taunt, bully or deride other teams during the programme and competition. They shall conduct themselves in an appropriate manner throughout the Programme.
- e. Each team will only be given one H2GP Pro kit for use throughout the Programme and during the competition. It is the responsibility of teams to handle their own kit with care. Teams will be held accountable for any loss, damage or destruction of the kit and/or its parts due to negligence or rough treatment.
- f. Any additional expenses incurred while participating in the Programme is solely to be borne by the team or school.

### 4. Photography and Videography

- a. When you participate in programmes by Science Centre Singapore and its Group of Attractions (SCS), you will be participating in programmes where photography, video and audio recording may occur. Such programmes include and are not limited to the H2GPSg teachers' workshop, tech chats, mid-season monitoring and national and world finals competitions.
- b. By participating in H2GPSg, you consent to interview(s), photography, audio recording, video recording of your team and students, and its/their release, publication, exhibition, or reproduction to be used for news, web casts, promotional purposes, telecasts, advertising, inclusion on web sites, or for any other purpose(s) that the Organisers (SCS, Chevron and Horizon Educational) and their vendors, partners, affiliates and/or representatives deem fit to use.
- c. You release the organisers, their officers and employees, and each and all persons involved from any liability connected with the taking, recording, digitising, or publication of interviews, photographs, computer images, video and/or or sound recordings.
- d. By entering event premises in Science Centre Singapore, you waive all rights you may have to any claim for payment or royalties in connection with any exhibition, streaming, webcasting, televising, or other publication of these materials, regardless of the purpose or sponsoring of such exhibiting, broadcasting, webcasting, or other publication irrespective of whether a fee for admission or sponsorship is charged. You also waive any right to inspect or approve any photo, video, or audio recording taken by the organisers or the person or entity designated to do so by the organisers.

### 5. Data Collection, Usage and Disclosure

- a. By participating in the programme, participants expressly authorise and consent to the collection, usage and disclosure of the information in this form and in subsequent forms related to the Programme by the Organising Committee.
- b. The Organisers may use the data collected for purposes such as but not limited to, team selection, participant identification and verification, administrative processes, dissemination of instructions,

logistical arrangements, and any other reasonable purposes according to the Organisers' Data and Privacy Policy (where applicable).

- c. Information collected includes, but is not limited to, participant email address, school, age, financial assistance status, shirt size, nationality and passport details (for world finalists), and any other personal information that the participant provides to the Organising Committee.
- d. Personally identifiable data is handled by Science Centre and is governed by Science Centre's Privacy Policy. The following are applicable:
  - i. Where appropriate, we may share necessary data with other Government agencies, so as to improve the discharge of public functions, and to serve you in the most efficient and effective way unless such sharing is prohibited by law.
  - ii. We may share your personal data with non-Government entities that have been authorised to carry out specific Government services. We will NOT share your personal data with other non-Government entities without your consent except where such sharing complies with the law.
  - iii. To safeguard your personal data, all electronic storage and transmission of personal data is secured with appropriate security technologies.

## 6. Safety and Indemnity

- a. Students and teachers that participate in the programme do so entirely at their own risk and shall be deemed to have understood the risks and conditions associated with the programme. Students and teachers-in-charge of the team are solely responsible for the well-being, discipline and safety of themselves / their students throughout the whole programme.
- b. While the Organising Committee will do their best to ensure safety and well-being of the participants, the employees and agents shall not be responsible for any death, personal injury, loss or damage to participants arising out of his/her participation in the programme.
- c. Teams shall adhere to the safety rules and regulations of at all times not cause nuisance, annoyance or cause damage or injury to the premises and equipment (including injury to the organisers' reputations), the other occupiers or users of the event venue. The Organising Committee reserves the right to stop any participant(s) or team(s) from taking part if there is a breach in safety rules.
- d. Where necessary in the event of an accident or other emergency occurring to the programme participant, the Organising Committee may at its sole discretion and expense, provide medical or other types of assistance. Such exercise of discretion shall not be deemed as an admission of liability by the committee for any injury or loss sustained.
- e. You hereby waive, release, covenant not to sue and forever discharge the Science Centre Singapore and its group of attractions and all other persons associated with the event, for all liabilities, claims, actions, or damages that you may have against them arising out of or in any way connected with your registration and/or participation in the event, including without limitation any liabilities, claims, actions, or damages caused by negligence of the above parties (including any negligent rescue attempt), the action or inaction of any of the above parties, or otherwise.

## 7. General Provisions

- a. The Organising Committee reserves the right at its sole discretion, to suspend, postpone or terminate the Programme or shorten or extend the duration, and/or amend, modify, delete, supplement, replace or revise these terms and conditions, without any liability or prior notification to any person, including but not limited to any participant. The revised terms and conditions shall apply from the date of publication of the revised terms and conditions on the Programme webpage.
- b. The Organising Committee shall not be liable to any party whatsoever for any delay in complying or failure to comply with these terms and conditions due to the occurrence of any event or circumstance beyond its control, including without any limitation to, acts of God, natural disasters or catastrophes, riots or wars (whether declared or not), terrorist activities, epidemics, health threats, quarantine requirements, change or issuance of new applicable laws.

- c. The decision of the Organising Committee on all matters pertaining to the Programme (including any dispute arising from gameplay, or any information transmitted or interpretation of this T&Cs) is final and binding on all parties.

By participating in the programme, I acknowledge that I have read and accept the above terms and conditions.
